Title: 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Family Medicine Update

Date: October 9-10, 2015

Credit: This program was reviewed and accepted for up to 14.5 prescribed hours by the American Academy of Family Physicians. This program was also accepted for up to 14.5 prescribed CE hours by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE). The South Central Accreditation Program approved the activity for 14.5 contact hours.

Target Audience: Primary care clinicians including family physicians, internists, and pediatricians are the target audience for this CME program. The course is especially beneficial to those physicians who are preparing for the certification or re-certification examinations of the American Board of Family Practice. Pharmacists, physician assistants, registered nurse practitioners and other health professionals were also invited to attend.
