Dr. Harrington's mission has been to develop integrated Palliative Care Programs at both UAMS and CAVHS with the goal of improving patient- and family-centered care for patients with a serious or life-limiting illness. Arkansas had one of the lowest rates of access to palliative care in the country, and Dr. Harrington's vision was to create and develop programs at both institutions using national standards. In the last five years, UAMS and the VA have become model institutions for inpatient and outpatient palliative care for the state and region. The UAMS obtained Joint Commission certification in Advanced Palliative Care and is now one of 36 certified programs in the country. The Hospice and Palliative Medicine Fellowship Program is the only one in the state and one of a few in the South. By increasing the palliative care workforce and training physicians, nurses, and other healthcare providers, access to quality palliative care will improve for the state.
